At the same time, PTSD does have some concrete effects on a person's memory. They may experience amnesia (an absence of memory), which involves disorganization or fragmentation of memory or total or partial forgetfulness. The study of traumatic memories challenges several basic notions about the nature of memory: (i) that memory always is a constructive process; (ii) that memory is primarily declarative (i.e. that people can articulate what they know in words and symbol) (iii) that memory is present in consciousness in a continuous and uninterrupted fashion; and (iv) that memory always disintegrates in accuracy over time.

Memory is described by psychology as the ability of an organism to store, retain, and subsequently retrieve information. When an individual experiences a traumatic event, whether physical or psychological, their memory can be affected in many ways. For example, trauma might affect their memory for that event, memory of previous or subsequent events, or thoughts in general.

Memory capacity, contents of memory, and memory processes may be variably affected by traumatic events and may mediate a differential causal risk in the transition to PTSD (Brewin, 2011). With respect to memory capacity, empirical studies inconsistently report on an increased general state of conditionability in patients with PTSD and find medium effect sizes at most (Lissek, Powers, & McClure, 2005).

The hippocampus in the brain is the area associated with episodic memory and is involved in creating and recalling episodic memories. When a trauma occurs, episodic memory can become fragmented and the sequences of events can get jumbled up in your brain. You can think of it like your memories being in a file cabinet.

The hippocampus is the part of the brain that stores memory. As a result of trauma, the memory is impaired. Dr. Campbell explains that when these four hormone levels are high, they interfere with the other structures in your brain that work to create your memory.
